It is with great pleasure that we announce the 13th World Rabbit Congress (WRC), which will take place for three days in Tarragona, Spain, between 2 and 4 October 2024.

The 13th WRC will take place at the Tarragona Exhibition and Congress Center. The Palace is located in the very center of Tarragona, a city recognized by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site. The city, characterized by its openness to the Mediterranean, has a wide range of hotels, leisure and culture.

This is an excellent opportunity for businesses in the industry to engage with scientists in the rabbit science research field. The Congress will attract a wide range of delegates, including both rabbit research scientists and stakeholders, and will include invited speakers from across the world.

Thanks to this, WRS is a *free access* journal for readers *with no publication fees* for authors.

Currently, our institutions and PhD students ask us to publish in Q1 open access journals to increase our indexes. Consequently, publishers, that are aware of this situation, make us must **spend a significant amount of money** to publish our knowledge yearly. However, **we have the solution in our hands**, a journal that publishes in open access and without fees. We are completely sure that, if WRSA members send high quality papers to WRS for 2-3 years we would place it in Q1, solving all these problems forever.

International and National Congresses

In the last six months, WRSA has news about three events held around the world.

7th American Congress in Rabbit Science (Varadero, Cuba)

On October 12 and 13, 2022, the VII American Congress of Rabbit Science of WRSA took place within the framework of the 2022 Animal Production and Agro-Development Convention, which was held from October 10 to 14, 2022 at the Plaza América Convention Center in Varadero, Matanzas, Cuba. The VII American Congress of Rabbit Science was developed in a hybrid way (in person and online) and summoned specialists, researchers, professors, students, breeders and producers from different latitudes, related to cuniculture. Throughout the conference, a total of 50 congressmen attended in person and 15 online, mainly from Cuba, Mexico, Argentina and Spain. The objective of the meeting was to "Motivate the exchange of experiences and results in rabbit production systems in the Americas, their technical, economic, environmental and social sustainability, and strategies for the improvement, conservation, use and characterization of animal genetic resources for rabbit farming". The congress opened with a lecture by Juan José Pascual, president of the WRSA on the current state of rabbit







farming, followed by three other invited lectures, 18 scientific communications, and a round table on viral hemorrhagic disease, as well as a total of 21 posters. These scientific contributions were directed both to the fundamental areas of knowledge (feeding, genetics, reproduction, pathology), but also to other important aspects in America such as socioeconomics, the value chain, and the use of rabbit farming as a tool for fight against hunger. During the first day, aspects of the vertical integration of rabbit production, the production and commercialization of rabbits in Cuba, feeding costs and limitations for obtaining raw materials, and concerns about not total slaughtering of the rabbit mass, the virus outbreaks occurred, the political will to eradicate this disease, increase the productivity of the species, the components of the value chains and the need for a correct articulation between all the links in the chain, were discussed. On the other hand, during the second day there was a debate mainly on aspects related to the





role of rabbit farming in society, not only for the production of quality meat, but also for its gender approach, the use of existing local resources in the Latin American countries, and the positive experiences of producers in the promotion of rabbit breeding. The congress closed with good attendance in the room, with a representation of students, producers, specialists, researchers and representatives of state production units and the Cuban Ministry of Agriculture (Director of the National Center for Animal Health and President of the livestock business group).

Annual conference ASIC 2022 "Special envoys to Nantès" (Castelfranco, Italy)

Last September 14, 2022, the Italian Branch of the WRSA, the Italian Rabbit Scientific Association (ASIC), held its Conference at Castelfranco Veneto (Italy). During the conference the results of the 12th World Rabbit Congress, held at Nantès (France) the last year (3-5 November 2021), have been presented by the young researchers awarded the ASIC scholarships. The conference aimed to offer an update on the main topics discussed in the World conferences on the different sessions. The meeting was opened by Dr. Luigi Ricci (Director of PIUE VI Office, Animal Production Sector, General Directorate for Policies and European Union of the Ministry of Agricultural, Food and Forestry Policies), who addressed the plan and maneuvers that the Italian government is applying to support the rabbit sector.



Prof. Gerolamo Xiccato presented a scientific report of the 12th World Rabbit Congress underlined the higher participation: 315 registration from 30 count ries (11 EU country and 19 extra-EU), with 21 Italian delegates and 27 accepted papers, mainly in the Quality of products section (29% of Italian Authors) and Pathology and Hygiene (20% of Italian Authors). Furthermore, the 12thWRC has seen a high participation of Italian researcher in the invited papers (38% of Italian Authors). Dr. Simona Mattioli in co-participation with Dr. Margherita Maranesi and Dr. Lorenzo Capucci have been the invited speakers of Reproduction and Pathology and



Hygiene session, respectively. Dr. Simona Mattioli during the ASIC conference highlighted the innovative approaches in the ovulation inductions for rabbit does point out the attention on the use of more animal



friendly-techniques. Dr. Lorenzo Capucci focused the attention on the novel vaccinations against the viral haemorrhagic disease, arousing a heated debate from farming and industrial participants. Prof. Angela Trocino presented, as Italian Session Referee of Ethology & Welfare, a summit of the invited paper (Prof. H. Rödel), the conclusions of the round table chaired by Dr. L. Maertens, K. De Greef, L. Fortun-Lamothe and some oral presentations on the topic, grouping the discussed topic in four thematic areas: i) promotion and development of



alternative systems in groups-rearing system, ii) group rearing systems for rabbits does, iii) alternative farming systems for growing and fattening rabbits and iv) tools for assessment of welfare on farms.

Others sections have been presented by young scientists, winners of the ASIC scholarship: Dr. Marco Birolo addressed the importance of alternative diets (i.e. high fiber or low-input ingredients) for does and weaning-rabbits (Nutrition & Feeding session); Dr. Matteo Cornaggia and Dr. Luca Palazzolo presented some contributes focusing on two main rabbit disease: Myxomatosis and Pastourellosis. They also underlined the problem of the persistence of antibiotic residues on environment (Pathology & Hygiene session). Finally, Dr. Simone Mancini summed up the main strategies used to improve the quality of raw or processed (burger, balls) rabbit meat, i.e. dietary supplementation of bioactive compounds or additives (Quality of products session). The conference was chaired by Prof. Angela Trocino (ASIC president) and Prof. Massimiliano Petracci (ASIC vice-president).

China Branch of WRSA co-organized the 11th annual China Rabbit Industry Development Conference

The 11th Annual Conference of China Rabbit Industry Development was held in Jinan City, Shandong Province, People's Republic of China on August 25-26, which was jointly organized by China Branch of WRSA, Rabbit Branch of China Animal Agriculture Association (CAAA) and Jinan local government. The theme of this year conference is Green and health, Technological Innovation, High Quality and Efficiency, and Rural Revitalization. The council meeting of the Rabbit Branch of CAAA was also held during the conference and new council committee were elected. Prof. Yinghe Qin was again elected as the president of the fifth council committee.

This is the first face-to-face conference since the outbreak of Covid19 in 2020. Around 400 representatives participated the conference physically. In order to meet the demands of more rabbit breeders and other participants, the conference was organized with different sessions, including academic report, experience-sharing, rabbit industry roundtable, indoor and outdoor exhibition, and the online visit to the rabbit farms.








In the academic report session, the organizer received more than 100 papers, these papers cover areas of breeding, feed and nutrition, pathology and hygiene, technological innovation, management and economics, and rabbit culture etc., of which 73 papers were compiled in the proceedings, and 22 papers were presented orally, moreover, Prof. Yinghe Qin, Prof. Laping Wu and other eight experts were invited to give lectures respectively from general development of rabbit industry, environment control, information service and marketing etc.

In the experience-sharing session, seven companies shared their experiences on the integrated industrial chain of meat rabbit, intelligent rabbit raising equipment, detection of respiratory diseases, automatic feeding system, fine management and healthy breeding system etc.

In the rabbit industry roundtable session, seven chairmen or general managers of flagship rabbit breeding companies in China were invited to interact with audience, share their experiences and answer the questions.

During the conference, the indoor and outdoor

2nd National Rabbit Congress (Bulacan, Philippines)

Industry stakeholders will in turn share their most relevant practices and applications that will truly realize the potentials of raising rabbits for meat, bannered in the theme "Rabbit industry for food sufficiency and better nutrition".




47th ASESCU Symposium of Rabbit Farming (León, Spain)
